The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students to fulfill lower-division general education requirements necessary for transfer and admission to both the California State University (CSU) and the University of California (UC). Completion of IGETC is not an admission requirement or admission guarantee for transfer to the CSU or UC, nor is it the only way to fulfill the lower-division general education requirements for students at the CSU or UC. Students may choose to complete coursework to meet the CSU or UC campus-specific breadth requirements of the university program to which they plan to transfer. A minimum of 60 semester or 90 quarter UC transferable units with a minimum 2.4 GPA (non-resident students 2.8 GPA) is required. Although courses may be listed in multiple general education areas (1-7), a course can be given credit in only one GE subject area. Consult with a counselor regarding which catalog year may be most beneficial and appropriate, i.e., if you are eligible to use previous IGETC patterns (pre-fall 2023).
