CHEM 071-Introductory Food Chemistry (UC/CSU) - 4 Units

A student learns nomenclature, structure, physical and chemical properties of amino acids, proteins, lipids, carbohydrates, vitamins, and minerals. This course is a survey of basic chemistry topics with laboratory, emphasizing fundamental principles of food science. The students will also learn the importance of water and biomolecules to food quality, safety, texture and taste as well as FDA's role in regulation of food additives and colorants. CHEM 211-Organic Chemistry For Science Majors I (UC/CSU) - 5 Units

Requirement Designation: Meets IGETC 5A & 5C; CSU B1 & B3

Enrollment Requirement: CHEM 102

This course is the first part of a two semester organic chemistry course sequence. Students are introduced to organic molecular structures, bonding, nomenclature including conformational analysis, potential energy plots, hybridization, stereochemistry and functional group chemistry, with emphasis on reactions and reaction mechanisms. It also includes the applications of instrumental methods in functional group analysis and identification of molecular structures. In the laboratory students learn the essential skills and techniques of preparation, isolation, purification, and analysis of organic compounds by employing standard and modern instrumental methods. This course also emphasizes the use and interpretation of Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR), Infrared (IR) Spectroscopy and Gas Chromatography (GC) in the analysis and identification of organic compounds. This course is part of the transfer sequence for careers in the physical, biological, and health sciences and a requirement for the Associate of Sciences degree in Chemistry.

This course is a continuation of Chemistry 211 with emphasis on the remaining functional groups and aromaticity. Emphasis is put on reactions and reaction mechanisms, stereochemistry, multi-step synthesis of a variety of organic compounds such as aromatic compounds, alcohols, phenols, amines, heterocyclics, aldehydes, ketones, carboxylic acids and their derivatives. The structures, formation and reactions of enoles and enolate anions are also studied. The structures and functional group

reactions of biological molecules such as carbohydrates, amino acids, polypeptides, lipids and nucleic acids are discussed. The laboratory work presents more techniques of multi-step synthesis, isolation, purification, and analysis of organic compounds using conventional and modern instrumental methods. This course also emphasizes the use and interpretation of Nuclear Magnetic Resonance (NMR), Infrared (IR), Mass Spectroscopy (MS), Ultraviolet (UV), and Gas Chromatograph (GC) in the analysis and identification of organic compounds. The Chem. 211 and 212 sequence satisfy the one year organic chemistry requirement for careers in the physical, biological, and health sciences and a requirement for the Associate of Sciences degree in Chemistry.

MATH 229-Statistics for Data Science (UC/CSU) - 4 Units

Requirement Designation: Meets CSU B4

Enrollment Requirement: Eligibility met to enroll in transfer-level math/statistics or Completion of Intermediate Algebra or the equivalent

This course examines fundamental concepts that are the building blocks for data science work, include gathering and summarizing data (descriptive statistics) and relationships between variables, probability techniques, and distributions such as conditional probability and Bayes Theorem, and hypothesis testing to facilitate decision-making (inferential statistics). This course will analyze the pros and cons in decision theory through the exploration of sampling and control limits. Students will study correlation and regression analyses such as linear models for data science and multivariate regression and the application of technology for statistical analysis including the interpretation of the relevance of the statistical findings to data science. The course will examine applications using data from disciplines including engineering, business, natural and social sciences, and psychology.
