Please note that most hospitals require volunteers to:

- Submit an application to Volunteer Services.
- Complete a background check.
- Undergo a physical exam.
- Provide a copy of your medical records (vaccinations/immunizations).
- Get an influenza vaccination during the flu season.
- Review and sign their organization's confidentiality policy.
- Follow the hospital's dress code.
- Attend volunteer orientation.
- Complete a minimum of 100-200 volunteer hours.

***Kaiser Permanente – Los Angeles Medical Center Volunteer Service Requirements:**

- Complete the General Adult Volunteer application
- Commit to a MINIMUM of 200 hours in one year
- Participate in a virtual information session

- Pass our Health Screening process
- Creating a *ReadySet* account
- Upload proof of tests & vaccinations
- Clear with EHS
- Be able to communicate well in English (2nd language skills are a plus)
- Have a valid Social Security Number (SSN)
- Willing to be subject to a background check
- **Must complete *the Red Vest Concierge Commitment* before volunteering in the Radiology/Imaging Department as a *Care Extender* in the *Care Extender Volunteer Program*.**
 - As a Red Vest Concierge volunteer, we ask that you commit to a minimum of one (1) weekly shift. This schedule will be agreed upon with the Volunteer Management Team.
 - As a Red Vest Concierge volunteer, you must complete at least 40 hours in the role before you can transfer as a Silver Angel or **Care Extender** volunteer.
 - If you must be absent, notify the Volunteer Office of your absence.
 - If you are assigned a weekend shift and miss 3 consecutive weeks without a valid reason, we may remove you from the weekend shift and identify a shift during the week. (Weekend shifts are in high demand, therefore we are looking for committed volunteers to fill these shifts).
 - Please notify the Volunteer Management Team if you encounter any issues, problems or are having a negative experience in your unit.
 - If you require a schedule change, please give the Volunteer Office at least 2 weeks notice to make the change.
- **Care Extender Volunteer Program: (Radiology/Imaging)**

The Care Extender program focuses on ambulatory care, technician, and clerical-type roles. Volunteers focus on the patient experience in the outpatient setting, learning about non-clinical healthcare roles and the skills required to increase patient satisfaction.

- Member Check-in support
- Wayfinding
- Patient engagement
- Miscellaneous project support
- Member communication and information
- Patient escorts
- Assistance with visit follow-up steps
